STAGE GULCH TRAIL CONSTRUCTION STARTING SOON

Last fall, the City of Stanfield received word that it would receive an Oregon Parks and Recreation Department Local Government Grant to construct a nearly mile-long trail along Stage Gulch, from Sherman Street all the way to Edwards Road.

We are very excited about this improvement to our City. The trail will be open to non-motorized traffic only—walkers, joggers, and bicyclists. Due to its placement on our flood control levees, the trail will not be paved, but will be a fine, packed gravel.

You may see crews out beginning work soon. We don't have a timeline on completion of the trail, but we expect it to be complete by next Winter.

CITY BEAUTIFICATION: CODE ENFORCEMENT

The City of Stanfield is committed to keeping our community clean and tidy. If you have a code violation you would like to report, you can report the issue to City Hall or the Police Department. An effort is made to address each complaint in a timely manner after the complaint is received. A record of the complaint is kept on file and progress is tracked within the Police Department.

Our part-time Code Enforcement Officer is continually working on contacting residents about city ordinances. Our goal is to encourage voluntary compliance when addressing code violations by making contact with property owners and providing time to comply with the city codes. We follow this up with a visual check of the property to verify that efforts are under way, or that the issue has corrected. The Police Department believes voluntary compliance is the preferred way of resolving these issues. However, as a last resort and if necessary, a citation will be issued to the property owner or the City will begin abatement procedures. City abatement results in a lien placed on the property for the costs of abatement.

NEW PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Through a combination of grants and donations, the City will soon be purchasing new playground equipment to add to Bard Park. One set will be aimed at children ages 2 through 5, and another from ages 5 to 12. Both sets will be erected adjacent to the existing playground equipment, which will all remain in place, with the exception of the teeter-totters—those will be removed to make room for the new equipment.

We are very grateful to the Umatilla County Health Department, Good Shepherd Community Health Foundation, and the Wildhorse Foundation for the grants that will make this improvement possible.

We are also grateful for the donations from Krome Transportation and 3D Idapro Solutions that have allowed us to double the budget for this project.

The City hopes to purchase the equipment by the beginning of March, and complete installation by the end of this Summer.

SPRING CLEANING

Do you want to get a little spring cleaning done? Here are a couple of things that may help:

The Sanitary Disposal Transfer Station in Hermiston will be holding their annual spring clean-up week from April 1st through 7th. Customers can receive up to a \$14.00 discount off each load, which means that loads up to 2.5 cubic yards can be disposed of for free.

The City of Stanfield is holding a City-wide Yard Sale this year. Residents can sign up for space at the sale, which will be held at the Little League Fields on April 7th (the same day as the Little League opening ceremonies), or hold their own yard sale. Yard Sale Permit fees will be waived for that weekend, and if residents get their permit the week before, they will be included in the City's advertising.

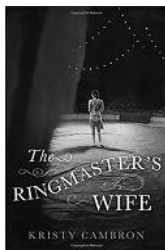
