Citizen Accountability Board

The Stanfield Police Department is in the process of establishing a Citizen Accountability Board (CAB). The CAB will be a 5 to 7 member board that meets with minor juvenile offenders and their parents to discuss the offense and the circumstances surrounding the offense. The board will assign consequences designed to hold the youth responsible for his/her actions and accountable to the community and the victim.

Recent Ordinances and Resolutions

Transient Room Tax – This ordinance imposes a tax on hotel room and RV Park space for customers staying less than 30 days.

Chronic Nuisance Property – This ordinance is separate from the Nuisance Regulations, which is what our Code Enforcement Officer enforces. The Chronic Nuisance Property ordinance gives our Police Department another tool in striving to reduce the number of problem properties in Stanfield where there are noise, drugs, fighting or other problems on a regular basis, and the Police Department is being called out to the same place over and over.

Burning – We continue to receive a lot of questions on the Burn Ordinance. The Council did amend the burn ordinance to prohibit the burning of any yard waste (weeds, wood, trimmings, etc.). Stanfield does have the compost yard that can be used for free.

ROADWAYS: Please keep basketball hoops out of roadways when not in use. They become a road hazard when left out unattended.

Dog Licenses: A license is required on all dogs in Stanfield, regardless of size. To obtain a license, you must show proof of rabies vaccine. There is a \$5 fee for each spayed/neutered dog and \$20 for each unspayed/un-neutered dog. Licenses must be renewed each year on or before July 1. Collar-bearing licenses must be kept on dogs for identification at all times. At no time is a dog allowed to roam freely throughout the City. Dogs must be kept on a leash or in a fenced yard. Dogs running at large will be impounded with a \$25 daily fee. If they are taken to Pet Rescue the fee is \$50 daily. These are only impound fees, there is an additional citation amount.

Water System Improvements

The City has begun the design phase of our water system improvements project. We received Community Development Block Grant funds from the Oregon Business Development Department that will pay for the design phase in full. Anderson Perry & Associates, Inc. is doing the engineering work.

At this point the only funding we have secured is design funding. The City Council has decided on a direction as far as obtaining construction funding. We are going to apply for construction funding through the Rural Development Program, which is part of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. **We will be holding a public meeting on Tuesday, February 22, 2011 at 6:00 pm to discuss the water system improvements project. The meeting will be held at the Stanfield Senior Center.** We will talk about our current progress, our timeline for completing the project, and what will happen to water rates and when. We hope you will continue to ask us questions about the project. We would like everyone to understand what we are doing and why.

4th of July Committee

The 4th of July Committee is comprised of 7 members, 2 of them being Stanfield High School students. 4 committee members have been appointed thus far. They are David Myers, David Stephens, Cecili Longhorn, and Logan Nevil. If you are interested, please let us know; there are still openings on the committee. If you are not interested in being on the committee but would still like to help out with the 4th of July Celebration, please let us know and we will put you to work or try to incorporate your ideas into the celebration. The responsibilities of the 4th of July Committee are to plan and administer Stanfield's annual 4th of July Celebration, and to recruit the necessary volunteers in order to make the celebration a success.

City Compost Yard

The City of Stanfield has a composting site for the citizens of Stanfield located on Hoosier Road. Only leaves and grass clippings can be dumped in the compost pits. There is a brush pile for tree limbs and brush. **NO GARBAGE, LUMBER, or METAL** can be accepted.

The finished compost can be used by all to be applied to gardens, flowerbeds, and lawns. If you have a pick-up you can load it yourself or call city hall and make arrangements with public works to have it loaded for you (sorry, no loading after 3 pm). Otherwise you can grab as much as you like.

The site is generally open from 7 AM to 7 PM. Beware, though, the gate locks automatically when its time to close.

YARD SALES A reminder that a Yard Sale Permit is required for all yard sales. There is a 3-day limit, and you can do 2 per year. You can get your permit at City Hall for \$5.

Past Due Utility Accounts:

A reminder that Utility bills (Water, Sewer, Garbage) go out on the 1st of each month and are due by the 20th. If they are not paid by the 20th there is a \$15.00 late fee. Accounts that are past due must be paid by the 10th of the following month in order to not get shut off. If you make special arrangements to pay after the 10th you will need to pay the past and current amounts due. Also, if you do get shut off, there is a \$50 on/off fee that will need to be paid along with past and current amounts due before you can be turned back on. Please do not call the water emergency number at night or on the weekends to be turned back on if you have been shut off. All accounts that are turned off must be cleared through the office to be turned back on.
